

We the undersigned hereby associate ourselves together in the following manner;

T

The name of this association shall be the "PRAIRIE ASTRONOMY CLUB".

II

The purpose of the association shall be to participate in and encourage the study of astronomy and related subjects for the benefit of the members and of the general public.

III .

There shall be two types of members, regular and junior. All members who have passed their eighteenth birthdays shall be regular members. All members who have not passed thier eighteenth birthdays shall have the option of being regular members or junior members.

IV

There shall be elected from the regular members the following officers, each to serve for a term of one year or until his successor is elected and qualified; President, Vice President, Secretary, Treasurer, and Program Chairman. These five officers acting together shall constitute the Exective Committee which shall be the governing body of the association and any three shall constitute a quorum. All acts of individual officers and/or the Executive committee which seek to bind or commit the association in any way shall be submitted for approval of disapproval at the next meeting of members: probided however, no act of any officer or of the Executive committee can bind the association in any monetary amount exceeding the amount then in the treasury of the association, except upon two-thirds vote of the regular members present at any regular meeting; provided, further, no individual member shall have any liability for debts of the association.

The Executive committee shall adopt rules for conduct of all of the affairs of the association, changing them from time to time as they see fit.

The association may be disolved at any time by the written, secre	t vote of two



We the undersigned hereby associate ourselves together in the following manner;

I

The name of this association shall be the "PRAIRIE ASTRONOMY CLUB".

II

The purpose of the association shall be to participate in and encourage the study of astronomy and related subjects for the benefit of the members and of the general public.

III

There shall be two types of members, regular and junior. All members who have passed their eighteenth birthdays shall be regular members. All members who have not passed thier eighteenth birthdays shall have the option of being regular members or junior members.

IV

There shall be elected from the regular members the following officers, each to serve for a term of one year or until his successor is elected and qualified; President, Vice President, Secretary, Treasurer, and Program Chairman. These five officers acting together shall constitute the Exective Committee which shall be the governing body of the association and any three shall constitute a quorum. All acts of individual officers and/or the Executive committee which seek to bind or commit the association in any way shall be submitted for approval of disapproval at the next meeting of members: probided however, no act of any officer or of the Executive committee can bind the association in any monetary amount exceeding the amount then in the treasury of the association, except upon two-thirds vote of the regular members present at any regular meeting; provided, further, no individual member shall have any liability for debts of the association.
