

Duties of Officers

President: To organize and direct the monthly meetings, to organize and supervise all other club activities, to offically represent the club at meetings of regional and national importance, to delegate the authroity for the above, and the authority to make committees.

Vice President: To be responsible for meetings when president is absent, to be mediator in cases of procedural dispute, to assume the duties of any officer at the direction of the president, and to be in charge of club publicity.

Secretary: To handle all club correspondance and to be responsible for the distribution of information recieved through offical club correspondance.

Treasurer: To be responsible for all club funds and monetary transactions, to submit a report of the treasury balance at the beginning of every business session, and to be in charge of club properity.

Program Chairman: To be responsible for club programs, their formation and presentation.

Publications Chairman: To be responsible for printing and distributing of a club newsletter.

Recording Secretary: To be responsible for the taking of the offical minutes of the monthly meetings and of the board meetings, and to submit the minutes of the last meeting and of all intervening board meetings at the beginning of every business session.

Duties of the Board of Directors

To act upon any suitation which tends to obligate the club in any way.

The president may call a board meeting at any time by contacting each board member. Five members shall constitute a quorum. A proposal must be approved by at least four members to be binding.

Voting Requirements;

All paid members have the right to vote as specified by the club constitution and incorporation papers. Attendance at the time of voting is required, no exceptions to this. One membership, one vote. Family memberships, two votes.

Procedure at meetings:

Motions may be made by any club member other than president, and must be seconded by a club member other than president. They must be put up for discussion, but discussion time must be limited to ten minutes unless extended by agreement i.e. a voice vote.

1/# of the total votes in the club must be represented at a meeting for motions to be voted on. Motions must be voted on at the meeting at which they are introduced, unless that is impossible. A simple majority is required for approval of all motions, except those excluded by other club papers.

Rights of all Members:

To be notified of all regular club meetings and activities, to make and second motions at meetings, to speak out and be heard at all club discussions, to submit, for publication, articles to the newsletter, to submit, without charge, want ads for publication in the newsletter, and to be informed of all events and transactions happening in the name of the Prairie Astronomy Club of Lincoln, Nb.
