# **METEOR SHOWERS**

Did you miss the Leonids in November? They were great on the morning of November 17th, although not the "storm" that has been predicted for sometime in the next couple of years. In December, we have more meteor showers worth viewing.

The Geminid meteor shower will peak on Sunday December 14th. The ZHR (Zenithal hourly Rate) should be about 95 meteors per hour. Duration (where at least 24 per hours can be seen) should be

Also, the Ursid metoer shower peaks on December 22, with a ZHR of 20 and a duration of 2 days.

# MORE DOUBLE SHADOW TRANSITS **ON JUPITER**

If you missed Novembers double & triple shadow transits, you havd another chance. On the afternoon of December 14th, the shadows of Callisto and Io will transit Jupiter. Callisto's shadow will be visible from 8:42 am -1:19 pm CST; Io's shadow will be visible from 12:44 pm - 3:00 pm CST. This will be tough because it is during the daytime. But...

In the early morning hours of Wednesday December 31st, Callisto and Ganymede will cast their shadows upon Jupiter. Callisto's shadow will be visible from 2:59 am - 7:33 am CST; Ganymede's shadow can be seen from 1:11 am - 4:48 am CST. Best time to observe is between 3:00 and 4:30 am.
